From David's Desk:

As we move into this season of Lent, I am reminded of a friend that always gave up eating beets for Lent. This person never ate beets in the first place so I guess his selfdenial amounts to little self-sacrifice to make him closer to God.

Someone asked me about fasting the other Sunday. And I really don't remember what I told that person. I know the purpose of fasting to sacrifice something to move closer to God.

There are numerous mentions of fasting in the Bible. Jesus and his disciples fasted, the children of Israel fasted, and the early church fasted in the Book of Acts.

A friend of mine, George Donigian writes that there were three primary reasons that the Israelites and the peoples of Biblical Times fasted. These are: (1) forgiveness and reconciliation with God and others; (2) grief; and (3) in preparation for deep religious experiences. These are very good reasons for fasting.

I think too often we think the world and perhaps our culture is too far gone for a turnaround. We think that what we do does not matter in the scheme of things. This is the easy way out of things. When we think like this we become apathetic.

I challenge you this Lenten Season to fast from your attitude of Apathy. What you do can make a difference. We are God's People of the here and now. What we do is to build the Kingdom of God. Do not let apathy hold you or God's church back. We do not have to move at "Glacial Speed" we need to be quick and smart for the Kingdom of God.

So kick apathy out of your attitude this Lenten Season!
