This week I have been thinking about “Faith”. What is faith? Have you ever given a lot of thought to the meaning of faith? It is an intriguing topic.

You can find all sorts of quotes on faith. Corrie Ten Boom said “Faith is like radar that sees through the fog.” John Donne, an English poet of the 1600’s said, “Reason is our soul’s left hand, Faith her right.” One of the modern bloggers, Robert Brault, says, “At the point where hope would otherwise become hopelessness, it becomes faith.” I really like that.

Faith is a wonderful thing, but a lot of faith deals with who you place your faith in. One of my favorite philosophers, my father once told me, “You have to have faith in the cook to eat the hash.” That makes a lot of sense to me as I have lived my life. I have faith in God. I know he can do all things despite my shortcomings. I have faith in him even though things may seem to not go my way.

Madeleine L’Engle said, “Faith is what makes life bearable, with all its tragedies and ambiguities and sudden, startling joys.” That is what faith does. But I think the best definition of faith I have read comes from Ramona C. Carroll, who wrote a lot about eggs, “Faith is putting all your eggs in God’s basket, then counting your blessings before they hatch.”
