From David's Desk:

In today's lectionary readings I was reminded of the term *threshold*. It is interesting to note that the word *threshold* comes from the practice of threshing and that the literal "*thresh hold*," a place to store the grain that had been separated from the stalks.

Though we now think of a threshold as an opening or doorway, in the earliest uses the threshold was a lip of wood or stone at the bottom of a doorway that would keep grain from leaking out of a full store house. So a threshold, which I always thought of as a opening might have been the opposite. In some buildings, the threshold might have been something you could stub your toe on if you did not learn to cross it with a careful step.

Lately I have been thinking of myself as having been a threshold. The Apostle Paul says in 1 Corinthians 3:9 that we are God's building. Imagine each of us as a storehouse for the harvest of God's lovingkindness. How do we act as a threshold to others? Do we hoard our gifts, sure there is not enough? Do we hide the joys within by imposing a mask of self-deprecation? Or are we willing to rejoice in the opportunity we have been offered? - to offer nurture, bread for the journey, reassurance that there is enough grain, enough grace, and that life in Christ offers inexhaustible richness beyond measure?
